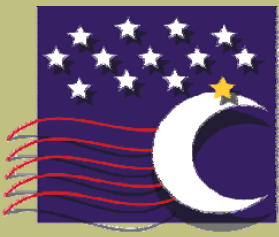

Teaching American History in South Carolina is a federally-funded project that provides **FREE** professional development to history and social studies teachers in the Palmetto State. Participants attend **10-day Summer Institutes**, which emphasize content, methods, and resources for teachers. The course will continue through the winter months as participants receive post-institute support from graduate students and cultural institution staff to create lessons based on primary source research. Participants turn in these lessons, share their work, and reflect on their professional growth at the Midyear Retreat in February 2010.

Summer Institutes

American History 1865 to the Present: Content, Methods, & Resources for Teachers

Summer Institutes are open to all social studies teachers in South Carolina. Class takes place at local repositories, libraries, museums, and historic sites in the greater Columbia, Florence, and Clemson areas. *Institutes are limited to 25 participants.*



Each Summer Institute consists of **10 full days of professional development activities** which include content instruction by a master scholar, master teacher workshops, and visits to cultural institutions.

All activities utilize local primary source materials or objects relating to the periods or themes being studied.

Upon completion of all course activities, each participant receives a **\$600 stipend** and **3 graduate credit hours in history** from the University of South Carolina.

Instruction will align with South Carolina Social Studies Standards for grades 3, 5, 7, 8, and 11.

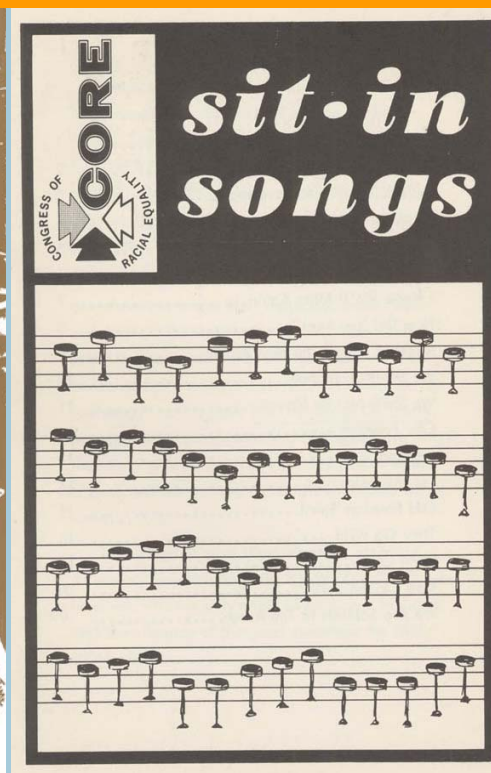
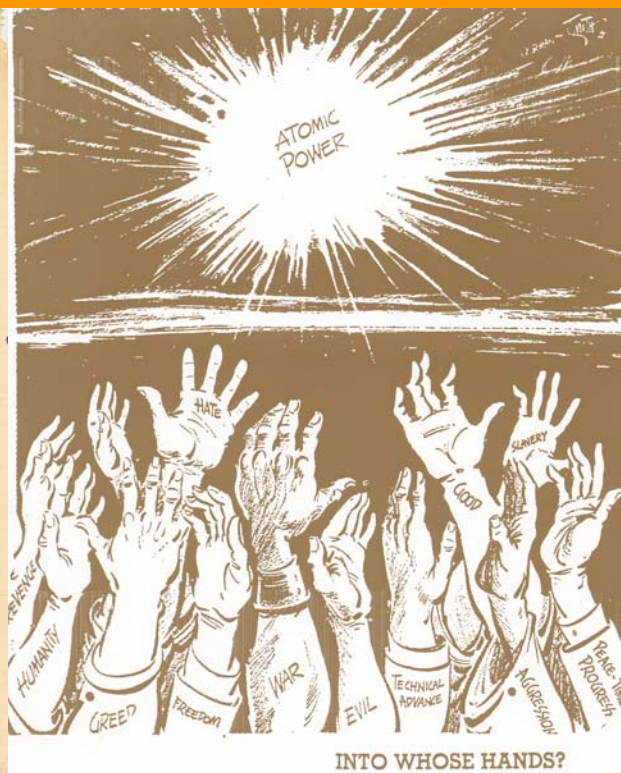
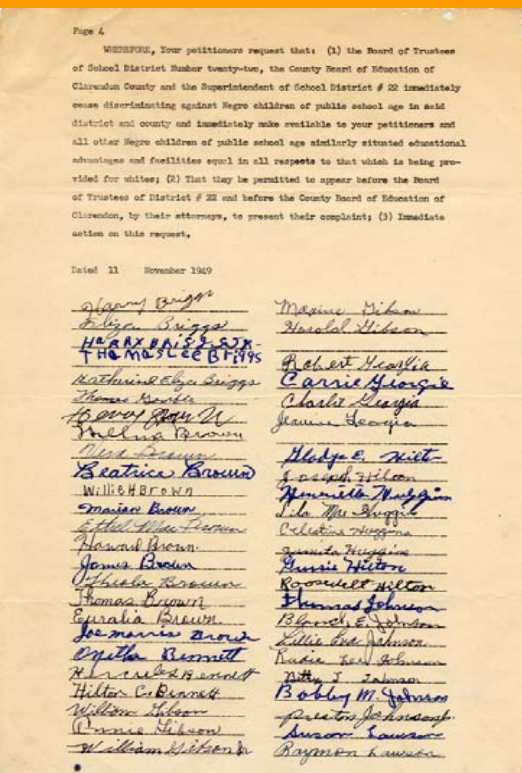
