

To Henry Dearborn

Creek Agency, July 31 1805

I send you herewith the estimate for the last quarter.¹ I agreed with the Chiefs business of importance to the U.S. would be laid before the National Council that I would bear part of the expence of their meeting the last month and have in conformity directed Mr. Hill to pay the amount charged in the estimate. The demand for wheels and Looms is increasing, as well as for ploughs and this fall we shall have to furnish a quantity of seed wheat.

I have heard nothing from you relative to the last quarter of the last year and the first of the present. Situated as we are in this country, most of those in the public service have but little other resources than their pay and of course are needy. I must repeat my wish that that money may be sent to the United State factor to be paid on the order of the agent to those authorized to agreeably [receive it] to the estimate.
