 this Province to me in hand paid at and before the Sealing and
 of these Presents by John Neilson of Prince Fredericks Parish the Receipt
 whereof I do hereby acknowledge Have bargained & sold and by these
 presents do bargain, sell & deliver unto the said John Neilson one
 Negro boy Commonly called or known by the name of Limmrick
 To have & to hold the said Bargained Negro unto the said John
 Neilson and his Heirs Exors. Admors and Assigns to his and their only
 proper use & behoof for ever. And I the said Mark Gutheray for my
 self my Heirs Exors and Admors the said Bargained Premises unto
 the said John Neilson his heirs Executors Admors and Assigns, from
 and against all Persons, shall and Will Warrant and for ever defend
 by these Presents In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 Hand and seal Dated at Charles Town this twentieth Day of March
 in the Sixteenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, & in the year of our Lord
 sealed and delivered
