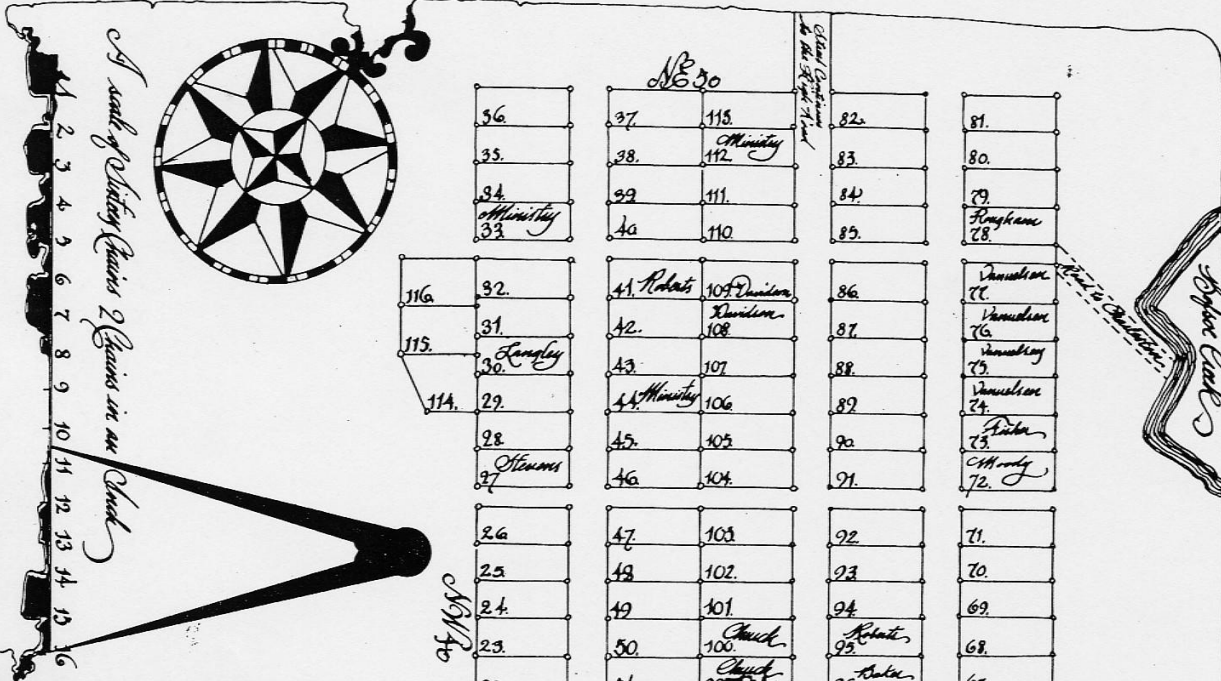


Primary Resource #2



Douchester in St. George's Parish June 7th 1742

Above is a plan of the town of Douchester with the names of some of the Persons names inserted in the lots. It is part of a Parcel of land Granted by the Lords Proprietors their Deputies to John Stevens (Now deceased) in the year 1696 in two separate tracts being in the White 4050 Acres, which said lands were laid up for the use of a certain Number of Persons. And by their Mutual agreement divided into lots of various Quantities at which time the above Represented Place was laid out for a Town. by the mutual consent of all the Parties then concerned thereon, equally to the above Plan, and hath since been the Owners of said lots of various Denominations. Four lots according to Respective Numbers by the Above said John Stevens and said Place hath ever since been considered as a Place for trade by David John Stevens + his Heirs + all other Persons there in concerned.
