

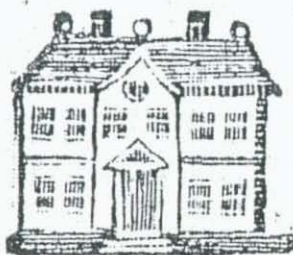

Civil Architect, House-builder in general, and Carver,
