

Hamburg--Mahlstedt, April 15th, 1946

Dear Mr. Rudisill,

As agreed upon I drop you some lines after letters can be sent again abroad.

In November 1945 I returned from Boston with the "ALEXANDIREN" over the ocean. On January 13th I was discharged from captivity by the English Occupation authority. At home everything was in condition, my wife and children healthy, the house not damaged. You can imagine how glad my wife and children were that daddy had returned. Of course I was very glad too.

I liked America very much, and I often think of the time I have spent there, especially of the time we have worked with the farm of Williamson.

Here I am working in my old profession as a mason. I am working 40 hours weekly, and I am earning RM 45.-- net a week.

I have already got stamps for you and souvenirs of Germany, which I'll send you when it will be allowed to send parcels abroad.
