Know all Men by these Presents, That
I *William S. Price* of the State aforesaid
for and in consideration of the sum of *Four hundred and*
fifty Dollars

to me in hand paid, at and before the sealing and delivery of these
presents, by *Lewis O'Bryan junior* of Colleton District
and State aforesaid

(the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge) have bargained and sold,
and by these presents do bargain, sell and deliver to the said *Lewis*

O'Bryan two negro slaves. (namely, a Boy
named *Limus* aged about twelve years &
a girl named *Sue* aged ten years

To have and to hold the said ~~two~~ the said two
negro slaves together with the future issue &
increase of the female

unto the said *Lewis O'Bryan* for his use

Executors, Administrators and Assigns: to *him* and *his* only proper use and
behool forever. And I the said *William S. Price* my

Executors and Administrators, the said bargained premises, unto the said *Lewis*
O'Bryan for his

Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, from and against all persons, shall and will
warrant and forever defend by these presents.

at *Walterboro* on the *thirteenth* day of *September*
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *thirtyfive*
and in the *fortyfirst* year of the Independence of the United States
of America.
